

### From Our New LMSC Chair: Dave Holland

My name is Dave Holland and I'm pleased to serve as the new Chair of our LMSC. I have been involved with swimming since age 7, and with USMS since 1997, when I turned 30 and decided that I needed to lose 15 lbs. I live in Richmond, practice at NOVA, and compete with VMST.

First of all, if you do know what the acronym LMSC stands for, please let me know. I think it includes the word "local", which makes no sense to me, as we have more than a 1000 members throughout Virginia and part of West Virginia. Of course, Masters has its own rules and lingo that have always baffled the mind- you can live in Missouri and swim for Virginia Masters (and we encourage that, especially for relays), be married for 50 years and swim "unattached", or sign up for a meet as "one event" and swim 9 events. Go figure. Different strokes for different folks...

I did not run on a platform and I did not have an opponent. I was asked and initially said "no", and then was asked to be on a nominating committee. Our committee was not successful in finding someone who said "yes" with any umph to their voice, so here I am. I heard that **Dave Holland** had gone to the *Rowdy Gaines Meet* in Orlando and asked him about it. His reply:

Betsy, I went, yes. Feel free to share this in the newsletter- A very good experience. Rowdy was on deck and shows the same enthusiasm and warmth that he does on TV. He talked to everyone and was everywhere, cheering and talking nonstop. At one point, as we passed near the locker room, he could tell I was getting ready for a race and said "what have you got?" When I said 200 fly, he smiled, put his hand on my forehead, and said something to the effect of "bless you son".

He also got very excited on Friday night because he helped to orchestrate the first ever 360+ relay. Four guys, 3 of them in their nineties and the young one at 88, swam an 800 free relay, and Rowdy was there coaching and encouraging every step of the way. Then he ran over to the microphone, informed the crowd of the historic nature of this swim, and everyone got into it. The entire crowd cheered them on as they set the first world record for men 360-399. Those old guys were just so happy as each one did his part over in lane 8, and climbed out using the ladder to shuffle over to a plastic chair that we set up for them. When it was done, they sat together there and everone wanted a photo with them. You could tell they had given it their all. One of the guys had a bad shoulder and did sidestroke most of the way, but rallied on the final 25 and did his full stroke. Rowdy said that each of them had been swimming since a young age. An entire lifetime of swimming, almost 360 years as a group, and still making history.

There were 200 + people at the meet. I swam my usual events, and had a decent 400 IM and 200 fly. I was pleased with my 200 breast, too, which is a relatively new event for me. I also

swam some 25's and that was a lot of fun, something different.

I was the only swimmer from VMST but I did run into Kelly Parker Palace and her husband Mark, who have swum with us in the past. As usual, everyone was friendly and it was nice to meet some new people.

I highly recommend this annual meet to others- it was a nice little 4-day vacation with great weather. I did nothing but eat, swim, sleep, and lie in the sun. That's my kind of championship!

Welcome to the 1st Colonies Zone Championship competition between the North (New England, Connecticut, Adirondack, Niagara and Metropolitan) and South (Delaware Valley, Maryland, Potomac Valley, Virginia and New Jersey). An individual may compete at either site (Boston, MA or Manassas, VA) but points will be scored according to their team location. Points will be scored and bragging rights awarded to the winner.

**FACILITIES**: The Freedom Aquatic & Fitness Center is located on the Prince William Campus of George Mason University, 10900 University Boulevard, Manassas, Virginia 20110-2203. The pool is a 50-meter by 25-yard pool with movable bulkheads and will be configured as a 25-meter, ten-lane course. The length of the competition course is in compliance and on file with USMS in accordance with articles 105.1.7 and 107.2.1, but as a bulkhead course, is subject to length confirmation. Eligibility of times for USMS Top 10 and records will be contingent on verification of bulkhead placement. Additional lanes will available for continuous warm-up/cool-down throughout the meet. A Colorado Electronic Timing System with a newly installed scoreboard will be used for timing. There will be concessions, meet shirts, and swimwear on sale.

**ELIGIBILITY:** The meet is open to all Masters swimmers holding a valid 2014 or 2015 USMS registration card. <u>Your membership to USMS will be verified as a part of the online meet entry</u>. For paper/mailed entry, a copy of your USMS card must accompany your entry. Age is determined by a swimmer's age on December 31, 2014.

**ENTRIES:** Competitors may enter up to **five (5)** individual events per day, plus relays.

OnlineEntries(The preferable entry method): Use the following link for registration:

https://www.clubassistant.com/club/meet\_information.cfm?c=1605&smid=5851. Entry deadline is Friday, December 5<sup>th</sup>. Online entries are paid by credit card to "ClubAssistant.com Events".

<u>Mail in Entries:</u> The paper entry form is included in this meet information. A copy of your current USMS card must accompany your mail entry. Paper entries must be received by **Monday, December 1<sup>st</sup>.** Entry fees shall be paid by check to "Freedom Aquatic Club."

**FEES:** There is a Meet Surcharge of \$30.00 for pool and equipment. Individual event fee is \$5 per event, \$10 per relay team. Relays are deck entry only.

**SEEDING:** Short course meter seed times must be submitted for each event. An online time converter is available on the Club Assistant meet entry form. The meet director or meet referee shall have the right to change seed times that are obviously incorrect. Events will be seeded slowest to fastest with the exception of the 800.

**DISTANCE EVENTS:** You must check in **BY 3:30 PM** on **Friday** for the 800 free or you will be scratched from the event. The 800 free will be limited to **120 entries.** The 800 free will be seeded **fastest to slowest, alternating women and men.** No time (NT) will not be accepted for this event. Please ask a friend to count for you in the distance freestyle events. Swimmers entering the 800 free must enter using a provable time either from the USMS database or a written verification from the coach which must be sent to the Meet Director.

**RELAYS:** Relay entries must be submitted by 10:00 AM Saturday for Saturday relays and by 10:00 AM Sunday for Sunday relays. Entry forms will be available at the check in desk.

**PSYCH SHEETS:** Psych sheets will be available at: www.freedomaquaticclub.com/ColoniesZone before the meet.

**WARM-UP:** Warm-up safety rules will be strictly enforced. No diving is permitted in the general warm-up lanes. Swimmers must enter feet first in a cautious manner. Diving or backstroke starts will be permitted only in designated lanes, which are reserved for one-way swimming. Instructions from the designated safety marshal must be obeyed at all times. The use of equipment during warm-up is not permitted.

**AWARDS**: **Individual Events:** Medals will be awarded to first place in each age group, with ribbons for second through six places. Certificates for all participants will be provided with label records of your performance in each event. Trophies will be presented for the male and female high point winners. **Relays:** Ribbons for relays will be awarded for first through third places. **Team Awards:** Championship awards will be presented to the top three large, medium and small team division winners. **Scoring:** Individual events are scored 17-15-14-13-12-11-10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1; relays will be double. The 800 Freestyle Relays will not be scored. Participants must pay \$5.00 processing fee and complete mailing label at the Awards Table for award(s) to be mailed.

**RESULTS:** Results will be available on-line at **http://www.freedomaquaticclub.com/.** The length of the competition course is in compliance and on file with USMS in accordance with articles 105.1.7 and 107.2.1 but as a bulkhead course, is subject to length confirmation. Eligibility of times for USMS Top 10 Records will be contingent on verification of bulkhead placement.
